- San Francisco Housing Opportunities Made Equal Project (SF HOME)
 - Families in market rate housing receive a monthly rental subsidy coupled with home-based comprehensive case management services. This subsidy is available for up to one year. During this time, families receive intensive services to help them successfully transition off the subsidy, either by increasing their income or by securing permanent affordable housing.
 - Families already living in subsidized housing can receive the home-based case management services without the subsidy.

ELIGIBILITY

For shelter placement; families must have a child under the age of 18 in custody and meet HUD guidelines for homelessness. Families must be referred to the shelter through Connecting Point (hotline: 1-888-811-7233).

The SF HOME Project serves families that are homeless as well as very low income families that are at immediate risk of losing their housing. A family is defined as a natural, adoptive and/or foster family with children in the household under age 18. A pregnant woman in her 3rd trimester, with or without a partner, is also considered a family.

The Positive Parenthood Project targets homeless and low-income families, although accepts referrals for Bay Area families with children age 6 and under, including families working towards reunification.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

- Kinstart Program: Kinstart offers services such as parent education and intergenerational activities to caregivers of 0-5 year olds.
- Kinship Support Network (KSN) adult services include one-on-one peer mentoring, parenting education, support groups, health assessments, and respite activities that help caregivers raise healthy children and maintain their own well being.
- KSN child services include tutoring, health prevention, career guidance, mental health care, and creative arts activities to help children stay in school and grow into self-sufficient adults.
- The Family Ambassador Project services include: Helping families connect to services that are relevant, accurate and culturally appropriate. Helping families learn about children's health and development. (for 0-5 years of age)
- Tiny Tots program for preschool children living with a relative caregiver. Activities include: recreation activities, art-exposure, story time and some behavior management. (3-5 years of age)
- Independent Living Skills: Helps to ease the transition to independence for teenagers in care of a relative caregiver. Skills taught include: college and career counseling; job, housing and financial assistance.
- School-based services to help children raised by a relative caregiver.

San Francisco residents - most of our clients are from the Mission District, as well as Bayview, Excelsior and Visitation Valley.

REFERRAL DOCUMENTATION

Services require no formal referral. Parents who are mandated to take Parenting Classes or Kids' Turn should bring appropriate referral in order to ensure proper court documentation.

ELIGIBILITY

Most services have no criteria. The Child Development Center has financial criteria in order to qualify for a subsidized slot. The Kids' Club is for kids 1-4 whose parents are on-site taking classes. Most services are in Spanish.

APPLICATION PROCESS

A simple intake form is filled out.

TIMEFRAME FOR SERVICES

Most adult services don't have a waiting period, though most workshops require signing up in advance. Some programs are only offered a few times throughout the year. Child Development Center usually has a waitlist, and Kids' Club is offered on a first come, first serve basis.

FEE

Most services have no fee. The Child Development Center has a monthly tuition or financial criteria in order to qualify for a subsidized slot. The Kids' Turn Program has a sliding scale fee.

- Prevention and Early Intervention Programs: through partnerships with community-based agencies, schools, health centers, childcare centers, and family childcare providers. Services include outreach and training, classroom observation, screening, clinical consultation, short-term treatment and referral.
- Outpatient Mental Health Services: 10 child outpatient clinics and 7 comprehensive outpatient clinics. Provide psychosocial assessment, medication monitoring, parent support groups, parenting classes, and individual, couple and family therapy at the clinics. Services may also be provided at school sites, health centers and child care facilities.
- Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Initiative: Through 13 community agencies, provides mental health consultation to childcare centers, family child care providers, and homeless shelters serving at-risk children and families through program consultation, therapeutic play groups, early referrals, parent education and support groups, and training for childcare providers.
- Primary Care/Mental Health Consultation Liaison Service: Through community-based health centers, provides on-site psychiatric and psycho-social consultation to primary pediatric care providers at community based health centers.
- Integrated Satellite Health Clinics: Located in 4 target areas: Visitacion Valley/Sunnydale, Castro/greater Mission, Chinatown/North Beach/Tenderloin, and OMI/Ingleside/Sunset. Provides integrated medical and mental health services to at-risk children and their families. The model is based on forming a partnership between a neighborhood family health center and a children's mental health clinic. Mental health services offered by the pilot clinics include individual, family and relationship counseling, violence prevention, child abuse and sexual abuse counseling, drug and alcohol use/abuse, school consultation, mental health promotion, group therapy, education, grief counseling, parent education and community referral.
- Mental Health Crisis Teams: Crisis intervention and mental health services for psychiatric emergencies. Inpatient psychiatric services are offered when a child or adolescent needs 24-hour care and treatment for an acute psychiatric problem and is a danger to self or others.
- Intensive Case Management Programs (Family Mosaic Project and Children's System of Care): Provides intensive case management for seriously emotionally disturbed children. Using a wrap-around approach, each child receives a comprehensive assessment and a plan of care is created in partnership with the family.
- Hospitalization and Post-Hospitalization Transition Services: Coordination of and authorization of all acute and partial hospitalization, lengths of stay, and transition services from hospital when children are hospitalized based on medical necessity.
- AB 3632 Unit: CMHS handles all incoming referrals from SFUSD for children whose IEP teams, parent, or guardian have requested mental health assessment. Process, track all assessment referrals and complete mental health assessments and determine if a child is eligible for mental health services.
- Foster Care Mental Health Program: Developed to improve the coordination of mental health services for children in the city's child welfare system. A multi-disciplinary team works collaboratively with DHS and provides services such as: mental health screening, assessment, referral and service coordination, urgent care, treatment
